

Other Transfer Agreements and Arrangements

Collaborative Bachelor of Health Sciences (Addictions Counselling)

Medicine Hat College (MHC) and The University of Lethbridge (UofL) jointly offer a 4-year program leading to a Bachelor of Health Sciences (Addictions Counselling).

Students may apply to MHC or to UofL. Students applying to MHC spend the first two years of the program on the MHC campus, and the third and fourth years on the UofL campus. Students applying to UofL spend all four years on the University campus. Students at MHC may opt to leave the program with a Diploma in Health Sciences (Addiction) following two and a half years of successful study. In either case, entry and program requirements are identical and students successfully completing the four-year program graduate with a Bachelor in Health Sciences (Addictions Counselling), awarded by UofL.

Students from other post-secondary institutions may transfer up to half of the program requirements. All transfer arrangements must be approved prior to admission.

Students will be allowed 7 years to complete all requirements of the baccalaureate program and 4 years to complete the diploma exit option from the time of initial registration in HLSC 200/1000.

Important: *The following organizations have transfer agreements with Alberta post-secondary institutions. The information on the courses covered by these arrangements is presented for publication by the respective receiving institutions.*

Nechi Training, Research and Health Promotions Institute

Students who have completed the Community Addictions Training Certificate and the Advanced Counsellor Training Certificate after 1987 with Nechi Institute will receive fifteen (15) credits towards the Aboriginal Addictions Services

Certificate Program at Keyano College. Students must provide copies of their certificates along with an official transcript from Nechi.

Graduates of Keyano's certificate and diploma programs can receive transfer credit at Brandon University towards their First Nations and Aboriginal Counselling degree program.

Students who have completed the Community Addictions Training (CAT) series with Nechi Institute will receive advanced credit towards the Community Health Representative professional development certificate at Portage College.

Saskatchewan Indian Institute of Technologies (SIIT)'s Community Services – Addictions program

Students who successfully complete Saskatchewan Indian Institute of Technologies (SIIT)'s Community Services - Addictions program will be admitted directly into Keyano College's second year Aboriginal Addictions Services diploma program as full block credit.

Transport Canada

Students who have successfully completed the Private Pilot and Commercial Ground School at any Transport Canada approved Flight School, and have passed the corresponding Transport Canada examinations, will receive EAS 1xx (3) at the University of Alberta and GEOG 2xx (3) at The King's University College.

Students must present a letter issued from Transport Canada indicating total score and divisional mark. An authorized person at each flight training facility must identify the student's name and hours attended while enrolled in the Ground School as per student's Pilot Training Record.
