Dear Colleague,

I am pleased to share with you the Alberta Council on Admissions and Transfer's (ACAT) Transfer Patterns Report 2010. The Transfer Patterns report provides information about the volume and scope of student mobility in Alberta, including data for students transferring to an ACAT-member post-secondary institution from out-of-province and out-of-country.

The 2010 Report includes Mobility Tables which reflect the number of students who had reported (previous) post-secondary experience prior to being admitted to their post-secondary institution during the fall 2010 admission cycle. The "sending" institution refers to the last post-secondary institution attended, immediately prior to attending a program at the receiving institution during the fall 2010 admission cycle. While the mobility tables do not attempt to reflect numbers of students who have received advanced or transfer credit when entering their institution in fall 2010, the data provides insight on post-secondary accessibility for students in Alberta.

Highlights of the 2010 Transfer Patterns Study:

- A total of 12,328 students were admitted in September 2010 who had previously attended another Alberta post-secondary institution. This total reflects a **5.3%** increase from the previous year.
- A total of 6,985 students transferred into Alberta from another province, which is an increase of **19.8%** from the previous year's total.
- The combined total of 19,313 students entering an Alberta post-secondary institution, who had reported previous post-secondary experience, reflects a 10% increase from last year's total. This year, into-province transfers constituted 36% of all mobility, while within-province mobility constituted the majority at 64%.

I hope that you find the upward trends in student mobility in Alberta an exciting opportunity for post-secondary stakeholders to continue to work toward enhancing mobility opportunities for Alberta learners. INTRODUCTION

The mission of the Alberta Council on Admissions and Transfer (ACAT) is to be a catalyst for beneficial change and an advocate for learners in the areas of post-secondary admission and transfer throughout Campus Alberta. ACAT provides leadership and direction, as a cornerstone of Campus Alberta, in the improvement of educational opportunities for Alberta students through inter-institutional transfer. ACAT is committed to supporting and improving communication among Alberta post-secondary institutions and to promoting the advantages of a system of education, with all that this means for educational planning for the benefit of learners.

In the interest of gaining further insight into the evolution of the Alberta Transfer System, ACAT presents the results of the 2010 Transfer Patterns Study, based on reports from 29 post-secondary ACAT member institutions.

ACAT has been collecting data from institutional Contact Persons since 1979, creating three decades of data about the mobility of post-secondary students in Alberta. The report includes mobility within the province, transfer from other Canadian provinces/territories, and from around the world.

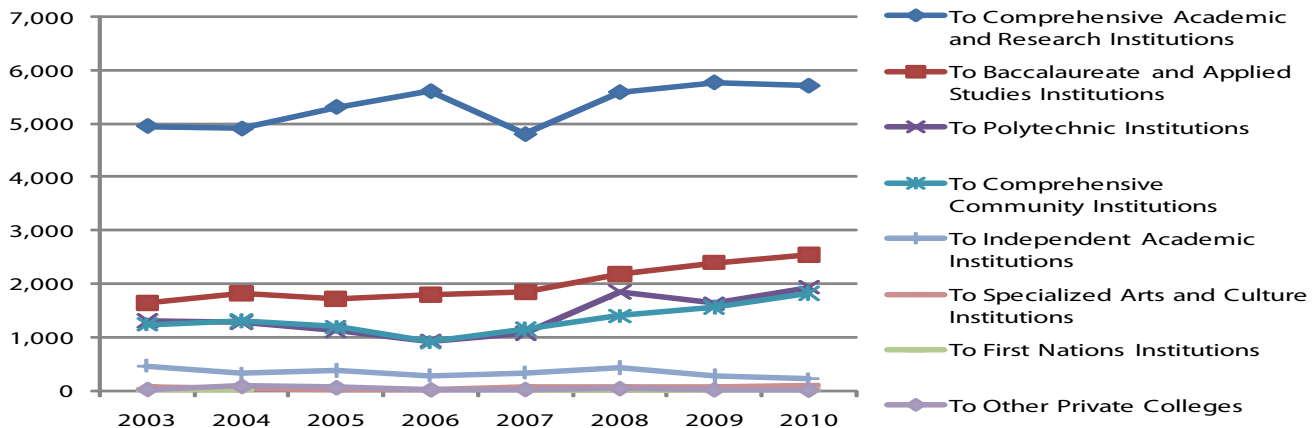
The attached Mobility Tables record the number of students admitted for the first time to their post-secondary institutions during the Fall 2010 admission cycle who had reported prior post-secondary experience. The tables show the last post-secondary institution attended as the “sending institution.” Institutions were asked to include students from all programs that are considered “undergraduate” programs at their institution—this would include students in post-diploma, after-degree, and some professional programs.

The Mobility Tables do not attempt to show whether or not the student received advanced credit for their previous experience, but rather are an overview of the mobility trends of students attending Alberta post-secondary institutions.

Five Year Trends: 2005 to 2010

Overall Transfer by Sector

This chart shows the types of institutions students have transferred to from other Alberta institutions and out-of-province institutions over the past five years.



Note: Please be aware that the numbers provided by Athabasca University (AU) are attuned to its unique role, which allows students to begin a program of study any time during the year. As well, most Athabasca University students do not apply for transfer credit until they have already received 6 credits from AU, so students who have come from other institutions but have not yet received 6 credits from AU may not be represented in the report. As a result of these unique situations related to AU, there is a significant under-representation of the number of transfer students who are currently studying at AU.

The Alberta Council on Admissions and Transfer includes membership of 36 post-secondary institutions, including membership from both Aurora College and Nunavut Arctic College. The Alberta institution sectors, as outlined in the chart below, are referenced throughout the report.

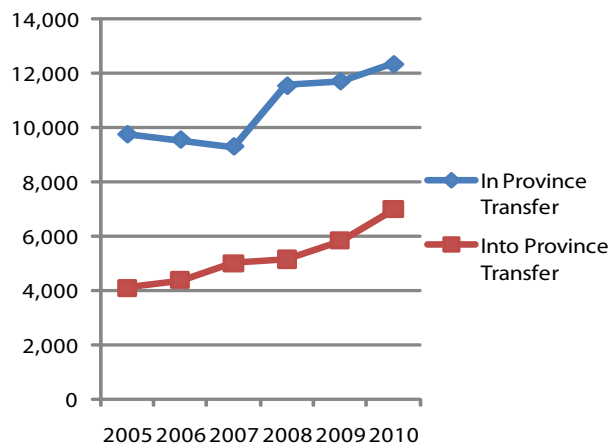

INTO-PROVINCE HIGHLIGHTS

- Transfers into the province in Fall 2010 numbered **6,985** students (including students transferring from other countries), an increase of 1,153 students or **19.8%** over the previous year's total of 5,832 students. This year's numbers increased or remained consistent in all sectors.
- Into-Province transfers constituted **36%**, while In-Province transfers made up **64%** of the total number of **19,328** students who experienced post-secondary mobility in 2010. In Fall 2009, into-province transfers constituted **33.2%**, while transfers within the province made up **66.8%** of the transfer students.
- In 1979, **2,993** students transferred into the province. Into-province transfers constituted 49.2% of the combined total in 1979.

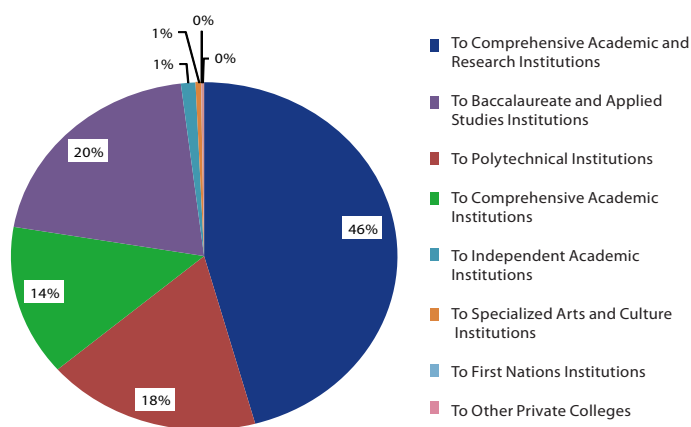
In-Province vs. Into-Province Transfer

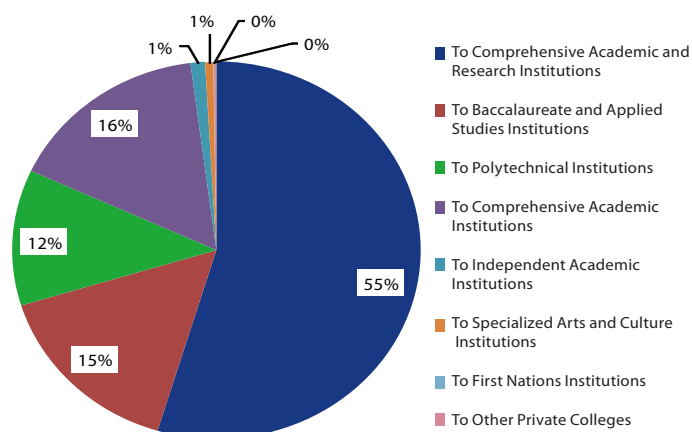

INTERPROVINCIAL TRANSFERS

Interprovincial Transfer - Highlights

- Interprovincial transfer increased **11.2%** from 2009, for a total of **4,833** students coming from institutions in other Canadian jurisdictions.
- The top five provinces for full-time student transfers into Alberta in Fall 2010 were Ontario, British Columbia, Saskatchewan, Manitoba, and Nova Scotia.
- The top five provinces for part-time student transfers into Alberta in Fall 2010 were Ontario, British Columbia, Saskatchewan, Manitoba, and Nova Scotia.

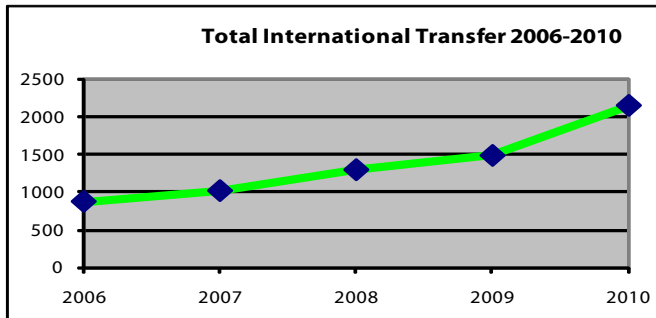

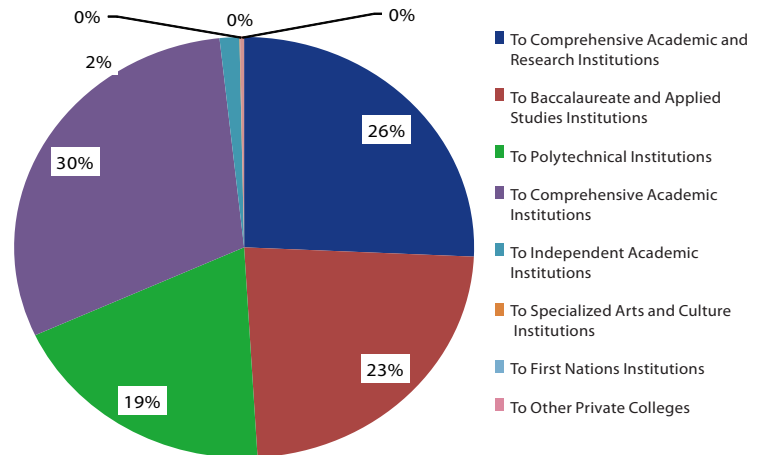

Total International Transfer - 2006 to 2010

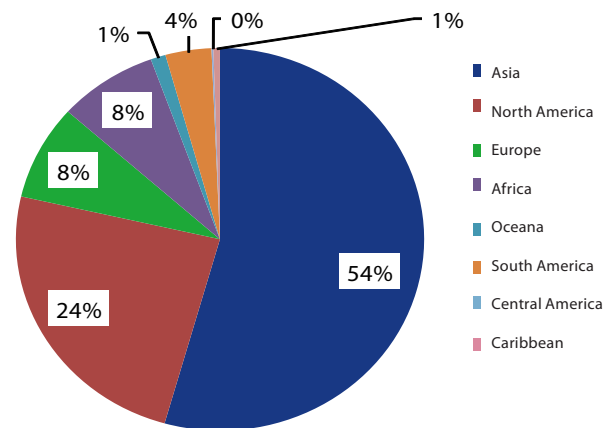
This chart shows the trend of students coming from institutions outside of Canada over the past four years.

MOBILITY TABLES

Since 1979, ACAT has collected information annually from post-secondary institutions about the number of students with prior post-secondary experience who move to another post-secondary institution. Each post-secondary institution was asked to record the number of students admitted for the first time to their institutions during the Fall 2010 admission cycle who had reported prior post-secondary experience.

NOTES:

- The data does not indicate whether these students received advance credit for their prior post-secondary experience.
- The data does not indicate if the post-secondary studies were used for admission to a program at the receiving institution.
- As admission records vary among the diverse institutions reporting on the following tables, strict comparability may be difficult.
- The reported totals may not fully reflect mobility as some admissions categories may be incompletely reported: for example, part-time students at non-university public institutions, visiting students, unclassified students, and students who are enrolled at two institutions at the same time.
- As Athabasca University offers continuous admission, students often take one course at a time so the distinction between “full-time” and “part-time” may not be appropriate. AU distinguished between “full-time” and “part-time” in its reports for 1993-1996. Since then, AU’s entry has been displayed as “part-time” although it includes an undetermined, though probably small, number of “full-time” students. Because of its continuous admission policy, the Fall 2009 admission cycle is defined as the number of new students admitted to Athabasca University between January 1, 2009 through September 30, 2009.

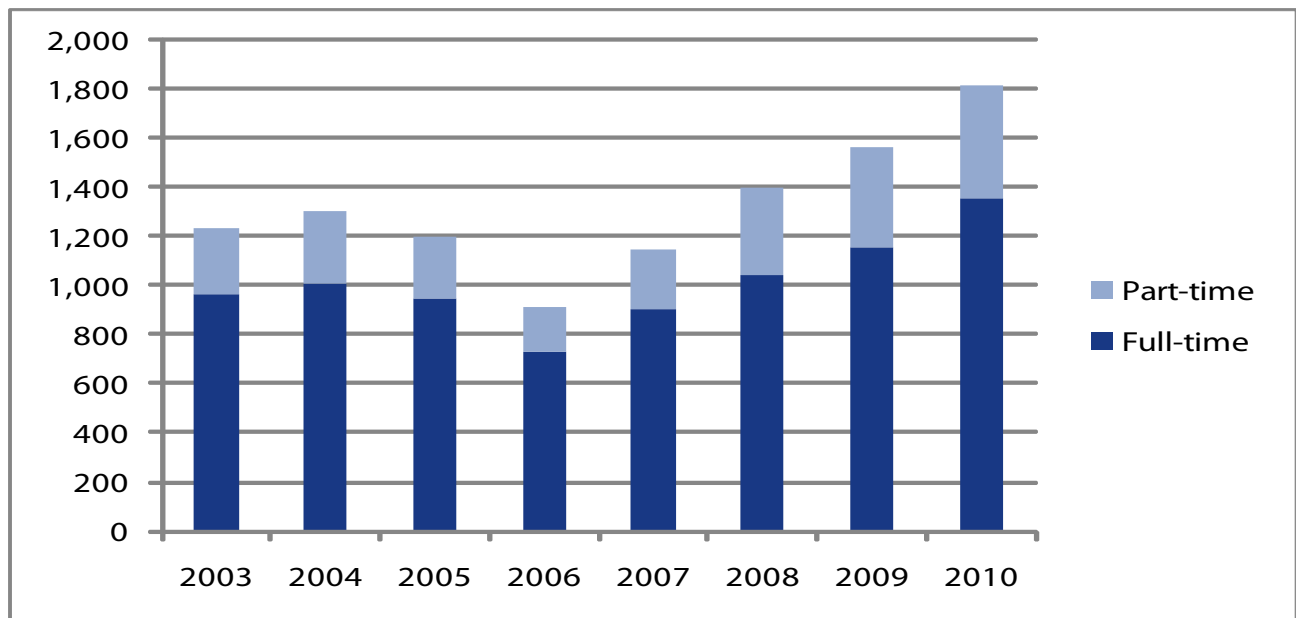
